4-H Weigh Dates

Even though it's still cold outside, its time to start thinking about upcoming fair projects for the 2018 Cherokee County Fair, which will take place July 24-28, 2018.

Friday February 23rd—Market Calves weigh in at Columbus Veterinary Clinic from 5:00-7:00 p.m. You can weigh in heifers but they will be in the same classes with the market steers. Maximum weight at first weigh in for steers/heifers will be 1000 lbs. Family nominations will be used again this year for all livestock and you will need to designate which animal belongs to which child at fair weigh in. Market heifers must be preg checked up to 30 days prior with vet certification proof to superintendent at final weigh in.

*Market Beef need to weigh at least 1,000 lbs at fair

<u>Friday April 13th</u>—Feeder Calves weigh in at Columbus Veterinary Clinic from 5:00-7:00 p.m. Must weigh between 275-650 lbs at initial weigh in. Must be born after Sept 1st.

*Feeder Beef must gain one pound a day, but weigh 999 lbs or less at final weigh in

Saturday April 14th—Market Swine weigh in at fairgrounds from 8:00-10:00 a.m.

*Market Hogs should weigh between 60-90 lbs at initial weigh in.

Monday April 16th—Goat/Sheep weigh in at fairgrounds from 5:00-7:00 p.m.

- *Goats need to weigh at least 50 lbs at final weigh in
- *Sheep need to weigh at least 90 lbs at final weigh in

4-H Enrollment

The new 4-H year starts October 2, 2017. 4-H enrollment must be renewed each year using the 4-H Online system. This year there is a \$15 fee mandated by the state 4-H office. PLEASE do not stop coming to 4-H meetings because you are concerned about the fee. At the state level, waivers will be offered for single income families, youth who receive free and reduced lunches, etc. Cherokee County's grant request was denied at this time. Also don't forget that enrollment must be completed and final on 4-H Online by May 1st in order to participate in the fair.

4-H Volunteer Orientation

Volunteers If you missed the Volunteer Re-Screen Session at the end of September you have until December 31 to get your Volunteer Application completed and turned back into me to send to the state office. These forms are available at the office. Every Volunteer that registered with Meghan is due to re-screen so please get this done. Please do not wait until the last minute as this is a fairly lengthy process. If you are a new volunteer (as of October 1, 2017) you must complete the online orientation or you can come into the office for a face to face session. To complete this online you need to login to 4honline, continue to your family, click "edit" next to your name, then at the top click "trainings" click "sign up for trainings". Then this will bring up the videos and quizzes for you to take. Each video is between 2 and 5 minutes. The quiz may be taken after each video. I will receive an email letting me know you have completed the orientation so you do not need to send the certificate to me. To sign up as a new volunteer there is some paperwork to complete please contact Katrina to get what you need to go through this process. 620-429-3849.
